Child, Youth & Family Services

Child, youth and family behavioral and physical health services provide treatment, prevention and education for children, adolescents and young adults.

Case management, specialty groups, family education, individualized and family therapy services all are developed to help participants successfully function in home, school and community settings.

Serious Emotional Disturbance (SED) eligibility is determined by assessing the acuity and duration of symptoms as well as degree of functional impairment (ages 6-21).

- **ASPIRE I/DD (Intellectual/ Developmental Disabilities)** Provides supports coordination to people diagnosed with a lifelong condition or disability
- **Autism (ages birth to 21)** Supports coordination and Applied Behavior Analysis referrals
- **Baby Court Collaboration** Between IMH/EC Specialist, DHHS and the courts servicing children (ages birth-5) removed from home, and caregivers with MI, SA and DV. Home-based services, attend court hearings and permanency planning case conferences and other services as ordered for recovery of the family unit
- **Cornerstone** Assists youths ages 15-21 transitioning to adulthood



- **Early Childhood Mental Health** Home-based services, school observations & office visits for children (ages 4-6)
- **Enhanced Family Care** Intensive home-based program for children, youth and families at risk of out-of-home placement and post in-patient aftercare (24-hour staff access)
- **Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health** Home-based relationship-focused services for parents, children (ages birth-6), and pregnant women; infant/parent psychotherapy; developmental guidance and assessments, PSI and depression screening for caregivers

- **Mental Health First Aid**
Training Certification course teaches participants to assess situations, select and implement interventions, and secure appropriate care for the individual
- **Parent Support Partner**
Works with families to identify strategies and achieve goals
- **Psychiatric Services**
Evaluations, medication management, treatment planning, crisis intervention, individual/group/ family therapy
- **School-Based Initiatives**
Early intervention services to underserved children and their families; coordination of services in designated DPS and Harper Woods schools



- **Triage** Intake, assessment and screening
- **Wraparound** Team-driven process for persons birth-21 involving the family, child and natural supports, agencies & community services
- **Youth in Transition** Group for adults 18-24 providing information, tools, and support to recover as positive role models
- **Youth Peer Support Services**
Delivered by specially trained persons with lived behavioral health experience

All consumers receiving services must have an ABILITY TO PAY calculated. Medicaid/Medicare and Private Insurance are accepted.
